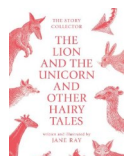




English Writing

English Reading

We will explore The Midnight Fox by Betsy Byars
Focus: friendship, courage, and personal growth
Develop: inference and prediction skills, summarising key events, identifying themes and character development, supporting opinions with evidence from the text, and understanding the impact of setting on the story.

Science

Sound
In science, Year 4 will explore the science of sound. They will learn about vibrations and how sound is produced, as well as the structure and function of the ear. Students will investigate how volume and pitch affect sound, plan and conduct experiments to explore volume, and evaluate their findings.

Religious Education

Christianity: What is Holy Communion and how does it build a Christian community?
Week 1: What did Jesus do and say at the Last Supper and how do Christians remember this today?
Week 2: Why do Christians share in body and blood of Jesus at church?
Week 3: Why do Christians share in body and blood of Jesus at church?
Week 4: How does the act of sharing Holy Communion influence a Christian's day to day life?

Mathematics

Fractions (3 weeks)
Students will learn to work with mixed numbers, improper fractions, and equivalent fractions. They'll practice counting, comparing, converting, and performing addition and subtraction with fractions and mixed numbers.
Decimals (3 weeks)
Students will learn to represent tenths and hundredths as fractions and decimals. They will explore place value charts, number lines, and practice dividing numbers by 10 and 100.

Music

Guitars: Developing Skills
Review the position of holding and finger board, to understand how to put the fingers on the fret to change pitch of string, be able to play simple guitar code, perform a simple tune or two Bars music in a small group

Geography

Northern Ireland
Year 4 will learn about Northern Ireland, including its geography, history, and landmarks. They will explore the region's division from the Republic of Ireland, visit notable sites such as the Giant's Causeway and the Marble Arch Caves, and gain an understanding of the cultural and physical features that shape Northern Ireland.

History

The Rise and Fall of the Roman Empire
In history, Year 4 will learn about key events in the Roman Empire, including the Punic Wars and Rome's expansion, the rise of Julius Caesar, and the reign of Caesar Augustus during the Pax Romana. They will explore the spread of Christianity within the empire and study the causes behind the Fall of the Roman Empire.

French

Where in the World?
Give basic opinions on food and drink, new food words, reading, writing and role play transactional conversations.

Art

Monuments of Ancient Rome
Children will be taught to develop their techniques, including their control and their use of materials, with creativity, experimentation and an increasing awareness of different kinds of art, craft and design.

Design and Technology

Miniature Playground
Children will be making a miniature playground which operates using a gear mechanism and electrical circuit for a KS1 child.
